Here are a few reasons why...

Children with a rare, life-threatening sarcoma from around the world are now journeying to Chapel Hill to receive surgical treatment from Dr. Andrea Hayes-Jordan. This rare sarcoma was considered inoperable before Dr. Hayes-Jordan developed an innovative surgical treatment, in which she removes hundreds to thousands of tiny tumors from the abdominal and chest cavity and then washes the area with a heated chemotherapy.

She is able to offer this treatment to children because you've helped support her lab's research.

When a child's cancer goes into remission, their journey is not over. Their cancer treatment may have lasting effects into adulthood so Dr. Andrew Smitherman, a pediatric hematologist and oncologist at UNC Children's, is working to solve that problem by characterizing potential side effects from treatments and using these indicators to predict other diseases.

Children with mixed phenotype acute leukemia - a rapidly spreading blood cancer- have a survival rate of only 47 - 75%. To improve this rate, Dr. Thomas Alexander, along with researchers from across the country made important discoveries about the genetics of the disease. Their data sets the stage for research into better treatment of this rare and high-risk blood cancer.
